



Fulbright U.S. Student Program: Study & Research Abroad | IIE

Description

The **Fulbright U.S. Student Program** is offered by the Institute of International Education (IIE) on behalf of the U.S. Department of State, giving U.S. citizens the chance to study, conduct research, or teach English in more than 140 countries. The **2027-2028 application cycle** is currently open, with candidates applying through the official Fulbright competition. This opportunity is ideal for graduating seniors, recent graduates, graduate students, and young professionals seeking international academic, research, and cultural exchange experiences while developing global leadership skills.

Scholarship Overview

- **Host Country:** United States (administering country) / 140+ host countries and territories worldwide
- **Study Level / Opportunity Type:** Fellowship (Study, Research, Graduate Study, or English Teaching Assistantship)
- **Funding Classification:** [Fully Funded](#) (benefits vary by country and award, but most grants include travel, living stipend, and health benefits)
- **Application Deadline:** October 6, 2026 (5:00 PM Eastern Time) for the 2027-2028 competition
- **Current Status:** Applications Open

Benefits

Eligibility Criteria

- **Nationality:** Applicants must be **U.S. citizens** at the time of application.
- **Academic Qualifications:** A **bachelor's degree** (or equivalent) must be completed before the grant begins. Most Ph.D. holders are not eligible.
- **Age Limit:** No official age limit is specified.
- **Work Experience:** No minimum work experience is required, though relevant academic or professional experience may strengthen an application.
- **Language Requirements:** Applicants must meet the **language requirements** of the selected host country or award, if applicable.
- **Admission Requirements:** Applicants must submit a competitive Fulbright application. Admission to a host institution may be required for certain graduate study awards.
- **Nomination Route:** Students apply through their **U.S. college or university's Fulbright Program Adviser** if available, while graduates and other eligible applicants may apply as **At-Large candidates**.

Available Fields or Programmes

The Fulbright U.S. Student Program currently offers the following officially confirmed opportunities:

- Independent Study

- Research
- Graduate Degree Study (available in selected host countries)
- English Teaching Assistant (ETA) Program
- Creative and Performing Arts Projects
- Critical Language Enhancement Award (available to eligible selected grantees)

How to Apply

1. Review the eligibility requirements and choose your preferred host country and award type.
2. Prepare the required application documents, including your project proposal, personal statement, transcripts, and references.
3. Apply online through the **Fulbright U.S. Student Program** [application portal](#).
4. If you are currently enrolled at a U.S. college or university, submit your application through your **Fulbright Program Adviser (FPA)**. Graduates and other eligible applicants may apply as **At-Large candidates**.
5. Complete any campus review or interview process, if applicable.
6. Wait for the national selection process and final award notification.

Application Route: Applicants apply **directly through the official Fulbright U.S. Student Program online application system**, either via their university's Fulbright Program Adviser or as an At-Large applicant. Applications are **not submitted through U.S. embassies or host universities**.

Required Documents

- Completed online application form

- Statement of Grant Purpose / Research Proposal
- Personal Statement
- Academic transcripts
- Three recommendation letters
- Foreign language evaluation (if required)
- Letter of affiliation (for research/study awards, if required)
- Portfolio (for creative and performing arts applicants, if required)
- Additional supporting documents required by the selected country or award type (if applicable)

Important Dates

- **Opening Date:** April 1, 2026 (for the 2027-2028 competition cycle)
- **Application Deadline:** October 6, 2026, at **5:00 PM Eastern Time (ET)**
- **Nomination Deadline:** Not applicable for At-Large applicants; campus nomination deadlines vary by U.S. institution
- **Interview Period:** Varies by institution and selection process; applicants should check with their Fulbright Program Adviser
- **Final Results Announcement:** Early 2027 (timeline varies by country and award type)

Is this scholarship fully funded or tuition-only?

The Fulbright U.S. Student Program is generally considered a **fully funded fellowship**. It may provide benefits such as a living stipend, round-trip airfare, health coverage, and other allowances. Specific funding details vary depending on the host country and award type.

Which nationalities and study levels are eligible?

The Fulbright U.S. Student Program is open to **U.S. citizens only**. Eligible applicants include graduating seniors, recent graduates, and graduate-level students. Applicants may apply for study, research, or English Teaching Assistant (ETA) opportunities depending on the selected award.

Is university admission required before the scholarship application?

No, university admission is not always required before applying. Requirements depend on the selected award and host country. Some graduate study or research awards may require an affiliation or acceptance from a host institution.

What is the exact deadline and timezone?

The application deadline for the Fulbright U.S. Student Program 2027-2028 competition is **October 6, 2026, at 5:00 PM Eastern Time (ET)**. Applicants should submit their applications before the deadline through the official Fulbright application system.

Is there an application fee?

No, there is **no application fee** for submitting an application to the Fulbright U.S. Student Program. Applicants can complete and submit the online application free of charge.
